Steps towards the Knowledge Base

- To identify, contextualise and collect data and documents relevant to OA policies regarding OA books in ERA: reports, policies, survey results, statistics.
- 2. To collect input on challenges and best practices regarding OA books from various stakeholders from ERA.
- To process, tag, structure, and make those materials available in the project repository for further analysis and publication.











BIBLIOGRAPHICAL DATA

- **Targeted survey** to national libraries and aggregators to learn about library data, including statistics and metadata on open access books:
 - 16 responses
 - 14 data sources
 - ~4 million items
- **Main outcome:** scattered data space in need of harmonisation and standardisation





ERA-WIDE SURVEY

- Goal: ERA-wide survey on OA monographs policies
- The survey was available from August to October
 2023
- Result: 454 complete responses

DOCUMENTS COLLECTION: Phase I - Identification

- Detailed protocol guiding researchers
- **Local experts** consulted at the onset
- Types of documents: policies, strategies, data, recommendations, plans, articles on OA to academic books

RESOURCE IDENTIFICATION

- Policies regarding open access to academic books
- Sources should be informed by PESTLE categories
- Timespan: since 2012 (10 years)



ACADEMIC BOOKS

Scholarly peer reviewed books including monographs, book chapters, edited collections, critical editions, and other long-form scholarly works. When looking for documentation we preserve an inclusive approach, i.e. follow how the academic books are defined in each analysed country.




DOCUMENTS COLLECTION: Phase II - Collection and pre-processing

- Selecting relevant documents
- Preparing abstracts and excerpts
- Applying relevant tags

Outcome

- 905 documents
- 462 policies
- 1552 excerpts
- 39 countries and 29 languages

INTERVIEWS

Goal: uncover the HOW of the OA to academic monographs in different ERA countries

- 39 individual and three group interviews were conducted
- All interviews lasted around 60 minutes

Processing:

- Transcription with HappyScribe
- Translation into English with DeepL (if needed)
- Anonymised transcript, validated by interviewees, to be published in the KB

Gender breakdown

- Female 24
- Male 23

Geographic

- 34 countries one per country
- 3 countries 2 per country (Germany, Netherlands, Belgium)

1. Authors will strive to provide open access to publications by: (a) depositing the electronic form of the final full text of the publication in the institutional repository immediately after publication and in other digital repositories, including the repository module of the Polish Bibliography of Science, the repository of the Centre for Open Science, without infringing the co-authors' and publisher's rights to the publication or, when th not possible, by depositing the author's version or any other version permitted by the publishing contract in the institutional repository; (b) making the publication available to the public in an institutional repository an other repositories so that everyone may access it from a place and at a time individually chosen by them and may use it free of charge and without technical restrictions within a preferred period of no more than 12 mo from the date of publication. (2) The authors themselves decide to grant a free licence under Creative Commons Attribution version 3.0 or later (CC-BY) or Creative Commons Attribution - Under the same conditions version 3.0 or later (CC-BY-SA).

Abstract

One of the main objectives of the 2-years project PALOMERA (Policy Alignment of Open access Monographs in the European Research Area, 2023–2025) funded by Horizon Europe is to investigate the landscape of Open Access (OA) policies regarding academic books and provide access to relevant documentation via the Knowledge Base.

Interviews with key stakeholders from ERA countries were part of the data collection. During this phase, researchers conducted 39 individual interviews and 3 group ones.

Every interview was conducted online (via Zoom), and lasted around 60 minutes. Interview was recorded on the consortium Cloud,The interview were transcribed with HappyScribe, translated into English via DeepL (if needed), proofread and anonymised.
